

WHY CLIMATE JUSTICE?

- Tackling climate change is not just a technical issue, it's a moral and political issue:
- Is a cause as well as a symptom of the dysfunction of the current broken system
- Can only stopped by addressing this dysfunction
- Those that are least responsible for the crisis are the ones most affected.
- World is very unequal now- the solutions to climate must also address this inequality



The Paris Agreement



Paris Agreement – *An important diplomatic* **triumph**

... hold the increase in global average temperature to well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels and pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C

...to undertake rapid reductions in accordance with best science

...on the basis of equity, and efforts to eradicate poverty.




FIGURE 9: FAIR SHARES VS. PLEDGED ACTION (mitigation in 2030 below baseline in Gt CO_eq)





The left bar shows fair shares of wealthier countries (26Gt) divided into two: an indicative portion (darker green) that they would undertake domestically, and an indicative portion (lighter green) they would enable in poorer countries by providing financial and technological resources. The left bar also shows a portion (blue; 8.8Gt) that represents the mitigation that poorer countries would undertake domestically as their own fair share. The right bar shows the mitigation effort pledged by wealthier countries (green; 5.6Gt), by poorer countries that is not conditional on the receipt of international climate finance (blue; 8.8Gt), and by poorer countries that is conditional on finance (blue-grey striped; 2.0Gt). The right bar also shows the resulting ambition gap (grey; 18.3Gt) including the 'submission gap' (grey striped) that represents mitigation associated with wealthier and poorer countries that have not yet submitted an INDC (1.3Gt and 1.6Gt, respectively). This figure corresponds to the '1950 / Medium progressivity' equity benchmark and includes INDCs submitted by October 1, 2015.

Living in an unjust world!

- 1 in 3 people nearly 3 billion people without access to clean energy or affordable energy
- 1 in 3 people over 2.5 billion people don't have access to sanitation
- 1 in 10 people close to 700 million people without access to fresh water
- 30,000 avoidable deaths each day

Climate Refugees

 On Aug. 31, Secretary of State John Kerry warned that climate change could create a new class of migrants, what he called "climate refugees" at a conference on climate change conference in Anchorage, Alaska. "You think migration is a challenge to Europe today....., wait until you see what happens when there's an absence of water, an absence of food, or one tribe fighting against another for mere survival," he said.

Climate & Environmental Refugees

- Climate affected People People whose lives are affected because of effects of climate change – sea level rises, water stress, collapse of agriculture, droughts and famines etc.
- Environmental refugees are people forced to flee because of natural disasters

People who want/need the change lack the power to make it.


Theory of Change: Those who want change work with others to acquire the resources they need to make the change they want.
